- Acceptable Use of ICT Facilities. This BYOT User Agreement is aligned to, and works in conjunction with, the Acceptable Use of ICT facilities policy and its associated guidelines and does not replace those documents in any way. By signing this agreement, the user also agrees to the terms of this policy.
- 2. **Personal Electronic Devices Acceptable Use Policy.** This Agreement is also aligned to and works in conjunction with the Personal Electronic Devices Acceptable Use Policy. By signing this agreement, the user also agrees to the terms of this policy.
- Network and internet access. Content accessed through the College network will be subject
 to monitoring and filtering. The College reserves the right to block student access to the
 network.
- 4. **Hotspot and Mobile Data Capabilities.** Students are not permitted to use hotspot or Mobile Data capabilities to circumvent the College network.
- 5. **Recharging.** Devices should be brought to the College fully charged every day as the College has limited facilities for recharging.
- 6. **Technical support.** As the device is neither owned nor managed by the College, the College is not responsible to offer any technical support.
- 7. **Insurance and liability.** Parents are strongly advised to insure their child's device for loss or damage. The College accepts no responsibility for the loss or damage of the device.
- 8. **Responsible use.** Any use of a device deemed inappropriate by the College may result in the withdrawal of BYOT privileges and any other appropriate disciplinary action deemed appropriate by the College. Refer to the Personal Electronic Devices and Personal Learning Devices Acceptable Use Policy for clarification.
